NewYork-Presbyterian Queens is located in a residential area with metered parking. Free lock-and-park spaces are available under the Van Wyck Expressway at College Point Blvd. and 58th Road. Shuttle buses to the Hospital run approximately every 10-15 minutes. 

Heart disease remains the number one killer in the United States in men and women despite remarkable advances in medical technology, pharmacotherapy, and research. Furthermore, the U.S. health care policies have a direct impact on how physicians practice today. Physicians require updates on the latest breakthroughs, information about controversial topics in cardiology and challenges that may arise in daily practice.
